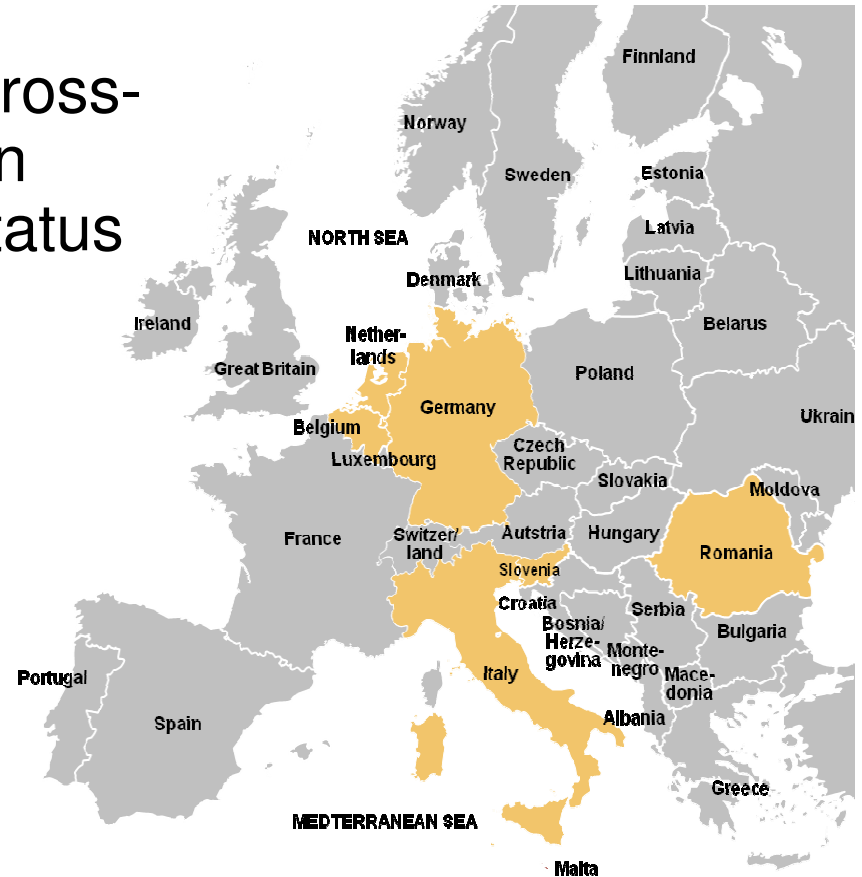


ECRN is a pilot service for cross-border transfer of information related to a citizen's Civil Status at a European level.

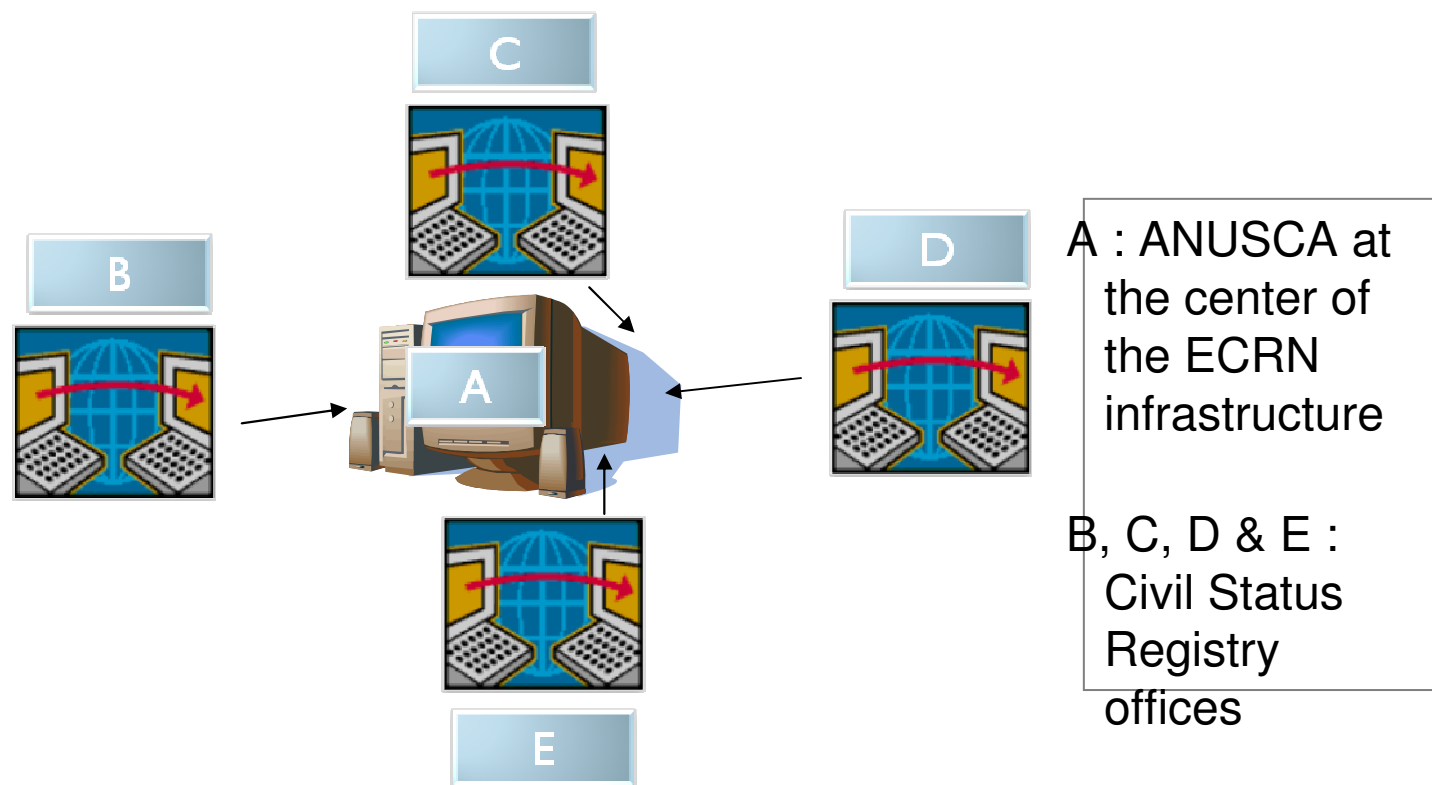

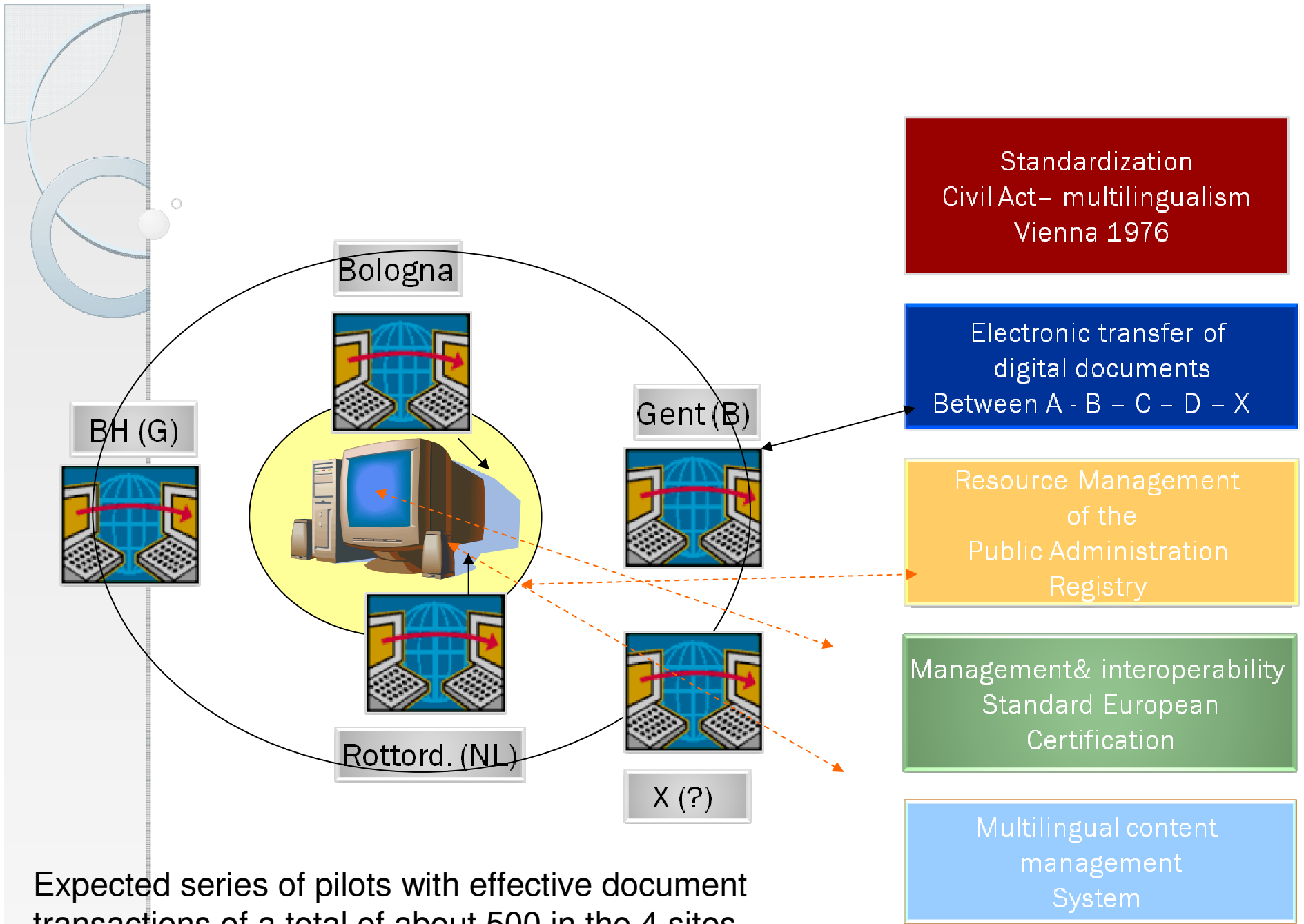

A Marriage in Belgium

Scenario :

Alberto is an Italian citizen of Bologna who currently lives in Ghent, Belgium.

Alberto will marry Kathleen, who is a Belgian citizen.

A public official in Ghent will use the ECRN system to inform the Register authorities of Bologna of the following:

- Identification of Public Services
- Authentication of credentials
- Selection of the receiving Public Administration
- Preparation of information to be transferred
- Digital signature for sending Information
- Transfer using the certified electronic e-mail

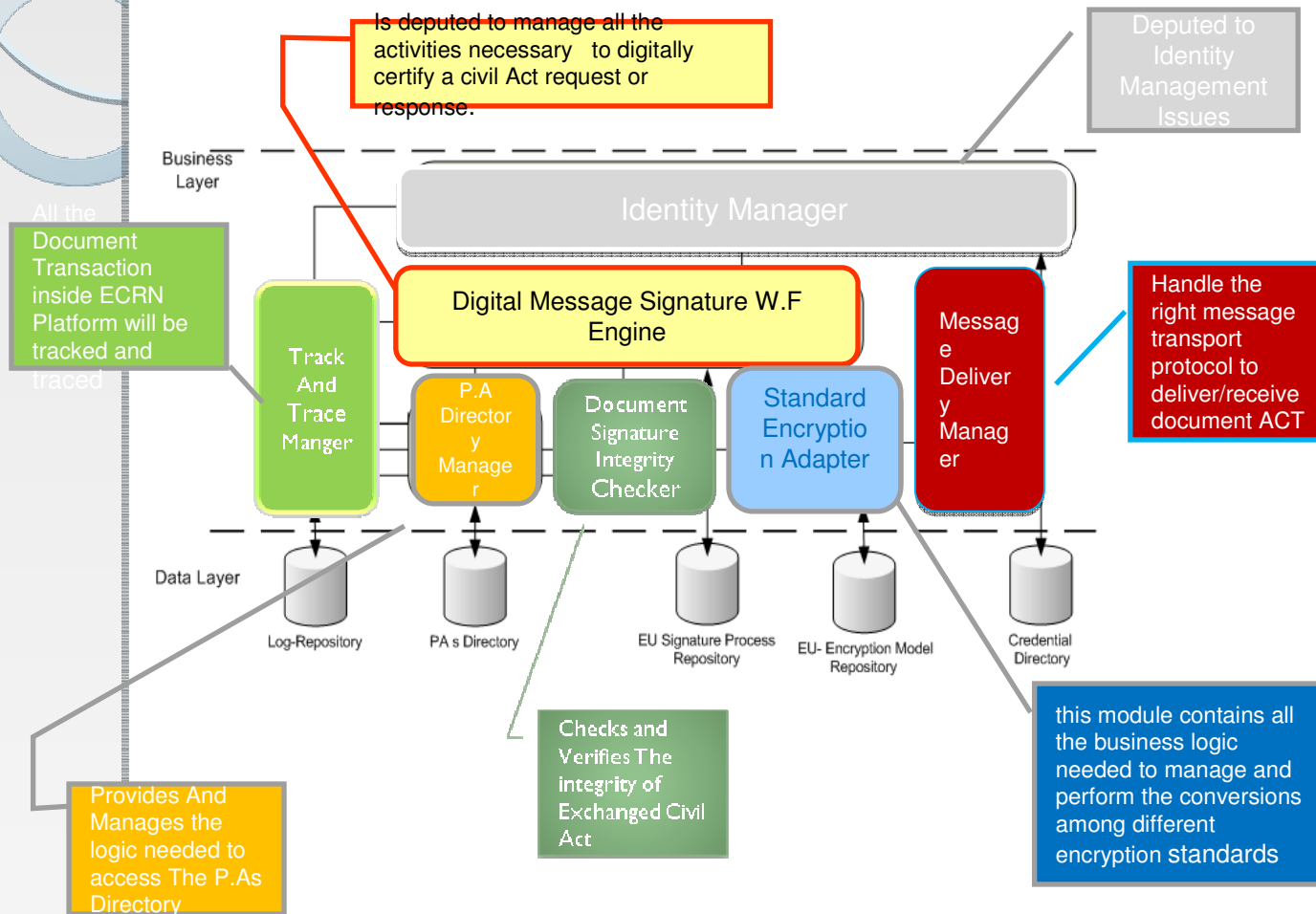




ECRN Objectives

- *1. Increase the efficiency of local administrative actions* by strengthening the administrations' ability to use new technologies, thus contributing to time efficiency and cost effective solutions.
- *2. Improve the Citizen-Administration relationship* by shortening delays for the public bodies to manage procedures and enabling citizens to reply in due time to requests for certification for inscriptions to schools, universities, and employment opportunities.
- *3. Enable the public authorities to gain immediate knowledge* in case of any changes in a Citizens Civil status, i.e. If a citizen conceives a child, gets married, or dies; the public registry of her/his home country can be immediately updated

ECRN Logical Infrastructure

- Digital signature for sending Information
- Transfer using certified electronic email

Main purpose

The ECRN project deals with the establishment of a pilot among the Civil Acts Registry of National Administrations to allow safe transmission and certain identification of the Civil Acts exchanged among European administrations. Due indeed to the growing number of European citizens living in countries different from their countries of origin, cooperation regarding the Civil State has become today a high priority for national administrations. The project aims at strengthening the administrations' ability to use new technologies, with a view to a major efficiency/effectiveness and inexpensiveness of the local administrative action in the European context. The main target concerns the establishment of an experimental system for the transmission of Civil State and information of the Civil Acts Office among the EU Local Governments.

Major objectives

- For the Administrations, gaining in efficiency in terms of immediate knowledge that a citizen has had a son abroad, or got married, or died in another Country, to manage in a very short time the information on benefits, changes, etc., connected to the events of the civil acts.
- For the Citizens, the possibility to obtain in a very short time Civil Acts. This will allow to European citizens to reply on time to the request of documentation for inscription to schools universities, employment opportunities, public administrations duties, etc.
- Effectiveness of the relationship Citizen-Administration. The request of certification of civil acts from a citizen of a country A, who lives in a country B, should be satisfied in a efficient way and adequate time lap, what is a appreciable improvement of the relation Citizen-Administration.

Information on the service

The project deals with the establishment of a pilot among the Civil Acts Registry of National Administrations to allow safe transmission and sure identification of the Civil Acts exchanged among European administrations (Bird, Death, and Marriage). Due indeed to the growing number of European citizens living in countries different from their country where they were born, the cooperation at the subject of Civil Acts Registry is become today an high priority for the national administrations. The project aims at strengthening the administrations ability to use new technologies, with a view to a major efficiency/efficacy and inexpensiveness of the local administrative action in the European context. Starting from a pilot below indicate, the project, using dissemination instruments selected on the way, will broadening his experience and enlarging his possible usage. The main target concerns the establishment of an experimental system for the transmission of Civil State and information of the Civil Acts Office among the EU Local Governments.
